Get to know your Councillors.

Throughout the coming year, the newsletter will include a "Get to Know Your Councillors" series, introducing all the



Parish Councillors. To start, we are pleased to introduce Parish and Borough Councillor Peter Bedford.

"I was first elected to Freiston Parish Council in May 1991, securing the most votes in the election. My decision to stand was prompted by the Priory Road Fuel Depot proposal, which would have

been located directly behind my garden, the Millers Row bungalows, and The Kings Head. This was a significant local concern, and the application was eventually rescinded after it was revealed that false information had been provided about the intended use of the depot.

This experience motivated me to stand for election to Boston Borough Council in October 1991, as I wanted to prevent similar situations from occurring elsewhere. After winning the Coastal Ward by-election, I have served a lengthy tenure on the council, holding various positions, including: Chairman of the Planning Committee, Vice-Chairman of the Housing Committee, Planning Portfolio Holder, Leader of the Council (2011–2017), and Mayor of Boston (2008–2009).

During my time in Freiston, I have contributed to numerous local improvements, including ensuring the precept is used for community projects such as the Danny Flear Community Centre, the church, the playing fields, and the bowling club.



As a member of WREN, I helped secure significant grants for initiatives such as new play equipment, the Church's West door, and footpath improvements. More recently, I have advocated for road safety improvements, including the installation of new signage.

Additionally, I served on Lincolnshire County Council from 2006 to 2013 and was honoured to hold the position of Chairman of the Council, supported by my wife Zita as First Lady.

If my health permits, I hope to stand again in 2027 to continue serving the residents of Freiston".
